NATIONAL AFFAIRS / GOVERNMENT SCHEME

1. Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal Launches New Maritime Initiatives to Enhance India's Global Trade.

On February 27, 2025, Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal, Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and Waterways (MoPSW), launched several initiatives, including One Nation-One Port Process (ONOP), Bharat Global Ports Consortium, and the MAITRI Application (App), aimed at modernizing India's maritime infrastructure and enhancing its position in global trade.

• These announcements were made during a stakeholder meeting in Mumbai (Maharashtra) focused on opportunities outlined in the Union Budget 2025-26 for the maritime sector.

Key Points:-

- (i) The ONOP initiative was launched to streamline processes with Immigration, the Port Health Organization (PHO), and Port Authorities. It aims to reduce container documentation by 33% (from 143 to 96) and bulk cargo documents by 29% (from 150 to 106), addressing inefficiencies, costs, and operational delays.
- (ii) The consortium comprises India Ports Global Limited (IPGL) in Mumbai (Maharashtra), Sagarmala Development Company Limited (SDCL) in New Delhi (Delhi), and India Port Rail & Ropeway Corporation Limited (IPRCL) in New Delhi. It aims to enhance India's global port connectivity and trade infrastructure.
- (iii) The MAITRI Application (Master Application for International Trade and Regulatory Interface) was launched to streamline trade processes, reduce bureaucratic redundancies, and expedite clearances, improving efficiency in India's

maritime sector.

2. MOSPI's TUS 2024 Reveals Women Spend 71 Minutes Daily on Employment-Related Activities.

In February 2025, the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MOSPI) released the 2nd edition of the all-India Time Use Survey (TUS) conducted during January-December 2024 by the National Statistics Office (NSO) under MoSPI.

- As per TUS 2024, the time spent by women in 'employment-related activities' was 71 minutes per day in 2024, which is 10 minutes more compared to TUS 2019.
- Meanwhile, the time spent by men in 'employment-related activities' increased from 263 minutes (in TUS 2019) to 287 minutes (in TUS 2024).

Key Points:-

- (i) The survey showed that 75% of males and 25% of females in the age group of 15-59 years participated in employment and related activities during a 24-hour day in 2024, compared to 70.9% for males and 21.8% for females in 2019.
- (ii) The time spent by female participants aged 15-59 years in unpaid domestic service declined from 315 minutes (in 2024) to 305 minutes (in 2019), signifying a shift from unpaid to paid activities.
- 3. CSE and DTE Unveil 12th Edition of State of India's Environment Report 2025.

In February 2025, the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) based in New Delhi, Delhi, and Down To Earth (DTE) Magazine released the 12th





edition of the Annual State of India's Environment Report 2025.

- The report was launched at the Anil Agarwal Dialogue 2025, held at the Anil Agarwal Environment Training Institute in Nimli, Rajasthan.
- The State of India's Environment Report 2025 provides a comprehensive analysis of key environmental developments and challenges faced by India.
- The report was officially released by Sunita Narain, Director General (DG) of CSE, alongside notable figures such as India's G20 Sherpa Amitabh Kant, former Planning Commission Deputy Chairperson Montek Singh Ahluwalia, and management expert Raj Liberhan.

Key Points:-

- (i) The report highlights rising temperatures, increasing extreme weather events, air pollution, and biodiversity loss. It also marks the 40th anniversary of the Bhopal Gas Tragedy.
- (ii) 140,000 new chemicals have been introduced into the environment, with 220 billion tonnes released annually, including 65 kg of cancercausing substances per second. India uses 255,000 tonnes of pesticides yearly, raising health and ecological concerns.
- (iii) India faced 255 days of extreme weather in 2024, damaging 3.2 million hectares of farmland. 2024 was the hottest year ever recorded, with global temperatures 1.60°C above pre-industrial levels.
- 4. Rajasthan Launches SSBY, Offering Rs 1.3 Lakh Accident Insurance Cover to School Students.

- In February 2025, Madan Dilawar, the Education and Panchayati Raj Minister of Rajasthan, launched the 'Shiksha Sanjeevani Bima Yojana (SSBY)' during a special event held at Residency Girls Higher Secondary School in Udaipur, Rajasthan.
- This is the first-of-its-kind scheme that aims to provide personal accident insurance coverage ranging from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 1.30 lakh to students in government schools.
- Initially, the scheme will cover schools in the Udaipur Division of Rajasthan.
- The scheme offers insurance coverage in case of accidental death or injury to students. It also provides insurance coverage in case of accidental death of a student's parent.

Key Points:-

- (i) Wonder Cement, Zurich Kotak General Insurance, and State Bank of India (SBI) are partners in the Shiksha Sanjeevani Bima Yojana.
- (ii) The state government plans to eventually expand the scheme, with the goal of benefiting approximately 1 crore school children across the state.
- 5. PM Narendra Modi Inaugurates Advantage Assam 2.0 Investment & Infrastructure Summit in Guwahati, Assam.

In February 2025, Prime Minister (PM) of India, Narendra Modi inaugurated the two-day Advantage Assam 2.0 Investment & Infrastructure Summit at Khanpara locality, Guwahati, Assam, held from February 25 to 26. Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia announced major initiatives to improve





digital connectivity in Northeast India during the Advantage Assam 2.0 Summit.

- Union Minister Scindia announced the launch of a 5G Laboratory (Lab) at Gauhati University in Guwahati, to promote research and skill development in advanced telecom technologies, supporting cost-effective testing and future 6G advancements.
- The Ministry of Communications (MoC) is investing Rs 1,800 crore through Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL), based in New Delhi, to expand 4th Generation (4G) and 5th Generation (5G) connectivity across Northeast (NE) India, including remote villages in Assam.
- Under the Samridhi Gram Yojana, each block in Assam will have a 5G Use Application Service to support telemedicine and online education.

Key Points:-

- (i) Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal, Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and Waterways (MoPSW), announced an investment of over Rs 4,800 crore to boost Assam's inland waterways sector during the Advantage Assam 2.0 Summit.
- (ii) Reliance Industries Limited (RIL) based in Mumbai, Maharashtra, Vedanta Limited also based in Mumbai, and the Adani Group based in Ahmedabad, Gujarat, have pledged to invest over Rs 1.5 lakh crore in Assam across various sectors, as announced by their respective leaders at the Advantage Assam 2.0 Summit.
- 6. Gujarat Recently Led India with 19,020 Hectares of Mangrove Plantation in Two Years Under the 'MISHTI' Scheme.

In February 2025, Gujarat recently emerged as the national leader in mangrove afforestation by planting mangroves across approximately 19,020 hectares at a cost of over Rs 76 crore under the Mangrove Initiative for Shoreline Habitats and Tangible Incomes (MISHTI) scheme.

- Gujarat remains determined to environmental conservation, aligning with the vision of 'Viksit Gujarat to Viksit Bharat.' This determination has positioned Gujarat at the leading edge of the Central Government's MISHTI scheme implementation.
- Gujarat's mangrove environment is strategically placed, with Kutch leading the charge at 799 square kilometers (sq km).

Key Points:-

- (i) In 2023, the Government of India (GoI) recently launched the MISHTI scheme on the occasion of World Environment Day (June 5) to increase mangrove forests across coastal states and Union Territories (UTs), ensuring a sustainable future for both communities and ecosystems.
- (ii) The Gol aims to plant 540 sq km of mangroves in five years under the 'MISHTI' scheme.
- (iii) The scheme was recently implemented by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC).
- 7. NITI Aayog Report: Women's Credit Monitoring Jumps 42% to Reach 27 Million in 2024.

On March 3, 2025, the Women Entrepreneurship Platform (WEP) of the National Institution for Transforming India (NITI) Aayog, in collaboration with TransUnion CIBIL Limited (formerly Credit Information Bureau (India) Limited) and Lucknow





(Uttar Pradesh, UP)-based MicroSave Consulting (MSC), released a new report titled "From Borrowers to Builders: Women's Role in India's Financial Growth Story."

- The report, launched by B.V.R. Subrahmanyam, CEO of NITI Aayog, highlights a notable surge in financial awareness among women, with 27 million actively monitoring their credit as of December 2024, reflecting a 42% increase compared to the previous year.
- In December 2024, women's share in the total self-monitoring base increased to 19.43% from 17.89% in 2023. Non-metro women showed higher engagement, with 48% growth compared to 30% in metro areas. Additionally, Gen Z women led credit monitoring, recording a 56% year-over-year (YoY) increase.
- The number of business accounts opened by women surged 4.6 times, from 8 lakh in 2019 to 37 lakh in 2024. Business loan disbursements rose to ₹1.9 lakh crore in 2024, up from ₹0.7 lakh crore in 2019, though these loans accounted for only 3% of the total loans availed by women.

Key Points:-

- (i) Since 2019, women's share in business loan origination has grown by 14%, while their gold loan share increased by 6%. By December 2024, women made up 35% of business borrowers.
- (ii) Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu (TN), Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh (UP), and Telangana contributed 49% of all self-monitoring women, with the southern region leading at 10.2 million in 2024.
- (iii) Northern and central states like Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh (UP), and Madhya Pradesh (MP) recorded the highest Compounded Annual Growth Rates (CAGR) in active women borrowers over

the last five years.

8. PM Modi Releases India's First Riverine Dolphin Estimation Report Showing 6,327 Dolphins Across 28 Rivers in 8 States.

In March 2025, Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi released India's first-ever riverine dolphin estimation report during his visit to Gir National Park (NP) in Gujarat, where he chaired the 7th meeting of the National Board for Wildlife (NBWL). The report was released on the eve of World Wildlife Day (WWD), observed annually on March 3 worldwide.

- According to the report, India has 6,327 riverine dolphins across 28 rivers in 8 states, with 6,324 dolphins found across the Ganga and Brahmaputra river basins, and the remaining 3 Indus river dolphins in the Beas river basin in Punjab.
- Assam, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh (MP), Punjab, and Lakshadweep are identified as the key dolphin hotspot states.

Key Points:-

- (i) The survey was conducted between 2021 and 2023 by the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) in partnership with state forest departments of Punjab, Uttar Pradesh (UP), Bihar, Assam, Jharkhand, Rajasthan, and non-profit organizations including Aaranyak, World Wildlife Fund (WWF), Turtle Survival Alliance, and Wildlife Trust of India.
- (ii) UP, with 2,397 dolphins, topped among the 8 states with the highest number of dolphins in the country, followed by Bihar (2,220), West Bengal (WB) (815), and Assam (635).





9. Union Minister Amit Shah Inaugurates 'Workshop on Sustainability & Circularity in Dairy Sector' in New Delhi.

In March 2025, Union Minister Amit Shah of the Ministry of Cooperation (MoC) inaugurated the 'Workshop on Sustainability and Circularity in the Dairy Sector' at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi (Delhi).

- The workshop was organized by the Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying (DAHD) under the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, and Dairying (MoFAH&D) in collaboration with the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB).
- Sustainability, efficiency, and circularity of resources in the dairy sector will play a key role in fulfilling Prime Minister Modi's vision of 'Sahkar se Samriddhi'.

Key Points:-

- (i) During the workshop, NDDB signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) to promote sustainable and inclusive growth in the dairy sector by providing technical, financial, and implementation support.
- (ii) NDDB introduced a new financing scheme with an estimated budget of Rs. 1,000 crores aimed at providing financial assistance for small biogas, large-scale biogas plants, and Compressed Biogas (CBG) projects, supporting the scaling up of various manure management models over the next 10 years.

10. India's First World Peace Center Officially Inaugurated in Gurugram, Haryana.

In March 2025, India's first World Peace Center was established under the leadership of Ahimsa Vishwa Bharti founder, Jain Acharya Lokesh Muni, and the efforts of Ahimsa Vishwa Bharti and was inaugurated in Gurugram, Haryana.

• The inauguration ceremony was graced by Ram Nath Kovind, former President of India, along with other dignitaries, including Gulab Chand Kataria, Governor of Punjab, Arif Mohammad Khan, Governor of Bihar, Nayab Singh Saini, Chief Minister (CM) of Haryana, and Rekha Gupta, CM of Delhi.

Key Points:-

- (i) Acharya Lokesh highlighted that the World Peace Center will serve as a beacon of spirituality and social unity, offering a platform for peace education, environmental conservation, equality, and institutional peace-building initiatives.
- (ii) The World Peace Center will play a key role in fostering awareness, promoting social responsibility, supporting sustainable development, and creating institutional networks to enhance peace and harmony.

11. Gol's PM-SYM Yojana Strengthens Financial Security for Millions of Unorganised Workers.

Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maandhan (PM-SYM) Yojana is a significant initiative launched by the Government of India (GoI) to provide financial security to millions of unorganised workers in India. It is a part of the Government's broader social security efforts and supports the goal of providing universal pension coverage for workers in the unorganised sector.





- The scheme is specifically designed for workers in the unorganised sectors, which contribute 50% of the country's Gross Domestic Product (GDP).
- It is a voluntary and contributory pension scheme, aimed at offering social security to unorganised workers.

Key Points:-

- (i) The scheme ensures a minimum pension of Rs 3,000 per month after the age of 60 for workers who are part of the unorganised sector and earn up to Rs 15,000 per month.
- (ii) The scheme is overseen by the Ministry of Labour and Employment (MoL&E), in collaboration with Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) and Common Services Centres e-Governance Services India Limited (CSC SPV), to ensure smooth implementation.
- (iii) As of December 31, 2024, more than 30.51 crore unorganised workers were registered on the e-Shram portal.

12. Dasra and Bain & Company Release 15th Edition of India Philanthropy Report (IPR) 2025.

In February 2025, Dasra, a venture philanthropy firm based in Mumbai (Maharashtra), and Bain & Company, Inc., a global management consulting firm based in the United States, released the 15th edition of the India Philanthropy Report (IPR) 2025.

• The report revealed that private funding in India's social sector is expected to grow annually by 10% to 12% over the next five years. This growth is mainly driven by family philanthropy from Ultra-High-Net-Worth Individuals (UHNIs), High-Net-Worth Individuals (HNIs), and wealthy individuals.

• UHNIs are individuals with a net worth of Rs 1,000 crore or more, HNIs have a net worth between Rs 200 crore and Rs 1,000 crore, and the "Affluent" category includes individuals with a net worth ranging from Rs 7 crore to Rs 200 crore.

Key Points:-

- (i) The total size of India's social sector funding, which includes areas like education, healthcare, and gender equality, is approximately Rs 25 lakh crore (USD 300 billion), making up 8.3% of the country's Gross Domestic Product (GDP).
- (ii) Public spending contributed 95% of the total funding, amounting to Rs 23 lakh crore. Private spending increased by 7% from FY 2023 to FY 2024, reaching around Rs 1.3 lakh crore (USD 16 billion).

13. India's EPHL and Belgium's JCD have formed a joint venture (JV) in India for the Light Tank Program.

In March 2025, John Cockerill Defence (JCD), a leading manufacturer of tank turrets based in Seraing (Belgium), and Electro Pneumatics and Hydraulics Private Limited (EPHL) from Pune (Maharashtra), announced a joint venture (JV) in India.

 This collaboration is an important step in strengthening defense ties between India and Belgium while enhancing India's self-reliant military capabilities.

Key Points:-

(i) The JV will mainly focus on the Indian Army's (IA) Light Tank program, specifically the Zorawar tank. Zorawar is a light tank developed jointly by the Defence Research and Development





Organisation (DRDO) and Larsen & Toubro (L&T), and is currently undergoing advanced trials.

- (ii) The JV will operate on a 60:40 ratio, with JCD holding the majority share. This ensures that advanced turret technology is transferred to India, supporting the country's Aatmanirbhar Bharat (Self-Reliant India) defense initiative.
- (iii) Additionally, Thales Belgium, based in Brussels (Belgium), has teamed up with India's state-owned Armoured Vehicle Nigam Ltd (AVNL) in Avadi (Chennai). Together, they will integrate a 70mm rocket system onto military vehicles for the Indian armed forces. In 2025, a key milestone will be a joint demonstration, including live firing exercises, as per Belgian embassy officials.

14. Union Minister Pralhad Joshi Inaugurates India's First Al-Driven Solar Manufacturing Line in Gujarat.

In March 2025, Union Minister Pralhad Joshi, from the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE), launched India's first Artificial Intelligence (AI)-powered solar manufacturing line at Goldi Solar Private Limited's new facility in Kosamba, Surat, Gujarat.

 The AI-enabled facility enhances precision, scalability, and efficiency, revolutionizing solar manufacturing and supporting India's shift towards a net-zero future.

Key Points:-

(i) The facility uses high-speed stringers that can produce an impressive 10,000 cells per hour with Al-driven automation. This ensures consistent quality, reduces errors, and minimizes material waste.

- (ii) It also incorporates AI-powered Automated Optical Inspection (AOI) technologies for real-time quality control. These systems use advanced computer vision to detect and eliminate microscopic defects.
- (iii) Additionally, the plant features AI-powered 3-Display Electro Luminescent (EL) and visual inspection devices, which check both the front and back of solar modules.

15. Cabinet approves Revision of Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme (LHDCP).

The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved the revision of the Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme (LHDCP) to strengthen livestock healthcare and disease prevention.

- The revised LHDCP consists of three main components: National Animal Disease Control Programme (NADCP), LH&DC, and Pashu Aushadhi. The LH&DC component has three sub-components: Critical Animal Disease Control Programme (CADCP), Establishment & Strengthening of Veterinary Hospitals and Mobile Veterinary Units (ESVHD-MVU), and Assistance to States for Control of Animal Diseases (ASCAD).
- The Pashu Aushadhi component has been newly added to the scheme, aiming to provide good-quality and affordable generic veterinary medicines to farmers, with an allocated budget of Rs. 75 crore.
- The total budget allocated for the revised LHDCP is Rs. 3,880 crore for two years (2024-25 and 2025-26), ensuring adequate funding for livestock disease control, veterinary healthcare, and medicine distribution.





Key Points:-

- (i) The scheme focuses on controlling livestock diseases such as Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD), Brucellosis, Peste des Petits Ruminants (PPR), Cerebrospinal Fluid (CSF), and Lumpy Skin Disease through immunization and disease surveillance.
- (ii) The LHDCP will enhance access to veterinary services through Mobile Veterinary Units (ESVHD-MVU) and ensure the availability of generic veterinary medicines under Pashu Aushadhi through PM-Kisan Samriddhi Kendra and Cooperative Societies.
- (iii) The scheme will help improve livestock productivity, reduce economic losses for farmers, generate employment, promote entrepreneurship in rural areas, and support overall economic growth in the livestock sector.

16. PM Narendra Modi Inaugurates 'Vantara' in Gujarat & Chairs 7th NBWL Meeting and Announces Asiatic Lion Population Estimation 2025.

During his visit from March 1 to March 3, 2025, PM Narendra Modi inaugurated Vantara, a 3,000-acre animal rescue and rehabilitation center in Jamnagar, Gujarat, and chaired the 7th meeting of the National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) at Gir National Park, Gujarat.

- He also visited Somnath Temple, Gujarat, offered prayers, and chaired a meeting of the Shree Somnath Trust.
- Vantara, established by Reliance Industries Limited (RIL) and the Reliance Foundation, is a mega wildlife rescue center in Jamnagar, Gujarat.

• It houses the world's largest hospital for elephants, equipped with hydrotherapy pools and jacuzzis to treat arthritis and foot ailments.

Key Points:-

- (i) PM Narendra Modi announced the 16th Asiatic Lion Population Estimation, scheduled for May 2025.
- (ii) He laid the foundation for the National Referral Centre for Wildlife in Junagadh to enhance wildlife health management and disease control.
- (iii) The National Board for Wildlife (NBWL), constituted by the Government of India (Gol) under Section 5A of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 (WLPA), is a 47-member committee headed by the Prime Minister, with the Minister of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change serving as the Vice-Chairperson.

17. GSI Marks 175th Foundation Day and Unveils Two Key Digital Initiatives.

On March 4, 2025, the Geological Survey of India (GSI) celebrated its 175th Foundation Day with a grand ceremony at its headquarters in Kolkata, West Bengal.

- The event was graced by Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy, Ministry of Coal (MoC) and Ministry of Mines (MoM).
- G. Kishan Reddy unveiled a commemorative plaque and a special postal cover to honor the 175-year journey of GSI.
- Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy launched two significant digital initiatives during the event: the Field Data Acquisition Application (App) and the Geo-





heritage App 'Bhuvirasat', aimed at improving the efficiency of data collection and promoting awareness of India's rich geo-heritage.

Key Points:-

- (i) On March 2, 2025, GSI organized a nationwide walkathon across 27 locations to kick off its 175th Foundation Year celebrations.
- (ii) The walkathon was designed to promote fitness and raise awareness about geoscience, with the theme "Geoscience for a Safe World".
- (iii) The GSI is one of the oldest geological surveys in the world and the second oldest survey in India after the Survey of India (founded in 1767).
- 18. Jaipur, Rajasthan Hosts 12th Regional 3R and Circular Economy Forum for Asia & the Pacific.

The 12th Regional 3R and Circular Economy Forum in Asia & the Pacific was held from March 3 to March 5, 2025, at Rajasthan International Centre in Jaipur, Rajasthan.

- The theme of the 2025 forum was 'Realizing Circular Societies Towards Achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Carbon Neutrality in Asia-Pacific'.
- The 3-day conference was organized by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), Government of India (GoI), in collaboration with the United Nations Centre for Regional Development (UNCRD) and Institute for Global Environment Strategies (IGES).
- Union Minister Manohar Lal and Rajasthan Chief Minister Bhajanlal Sharma jointly inaugurated the 3R India Pavilion during the event.

- (i) Manohar Lal also announced the launch of Cities Coalition for Circularity (C-3), a multi-nation alliance aimed at city-to-city collaboration, knowledge sharing, and fostering private sector partnerships.
- (ii) The forum concluded with the adoption of the Jaipur Declaration (2025-2034) by the member countries.
- (ii) The declaration serves as a non-political, nonbinding commitment to guide resource efficiency and sustainable urban growth for the next 10 years.

19. NITI Aayog Unveils NITI-FTH & Publishes Paper on "Quantum Computing: National Security & Strategic Preparedness".

In March 2025, NITI Aayog launched the 'Frontier Tech Hub (NITI-FTH)', a transformative initiative aimed at making India a technology-driven economy. It focuses on advancing frontier technologies for India's economic and social development.

- NITI-FTH will act as a technology action tank to promote cutting-edge technologies that contribute to human progress and environmental sustainability.
- NITI Aayog, in collaboration with the Data Security Council of India (DSCI), released a strategic paper titled "Quantum Computing: National Security Implications & Strategic Preparedness."

Key Points:-

(i) The paper addresses the rapid progress of quantum computing and its implications for sectors such as defence, intelligence, and

cybersecurity.

- (ii) The paper emphasizes the need for a proactive, multi-pronged approach to safeguard national security in the era of quantum computing.
- (iii) The Government of India launched the National Quantum Mission (NQM) in 2023 with a budget of Rs.6,003 crore to develop an indigenous quantum technology ecosystem.

• These announcements were made during a stakeholder meeting in Mumbai (Maharashtra) focused on opportunities outlined in the Union Budget 2025-26 for the maritime sector.

Key Points:-

- (i) The ONOP initiative was launched to streamline processes with Immigration, the Port Health Organization (PHO), and Port Authorities. It aims to reduce container documentation by 33% (from 143 to 96) and bulk cargo documents by 29% (from 150 to 106), addressing inefficiencies, costs, and operational delays.
- (ii) The consortium comprises India Ports Global Limited (IPGL) in Mumbai (Maharashtra),

Sagarmala Development Company Limited (SDCL) in New Delhi (Delhi), and India Port Rail & Ropeway Corporation Limited (IPRCL) in New Delhi. It aims to enhance India's global port connectivity and trade infrastructure.

(iii) The MAITRI Application (Master Application for International Trade and Regulatory Interface) was launched to streamline trade processes, reduce bureaucratic redundancies, and expedite clearances, improving efficiency in India's maritime sector.

21. MOSPI's TUS 2024 Reveals Women Spend 71 Minutes Daily on Employment-Related Activities.

In February 2025, the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MOSPI) released the 2nd edition of the all-India Time Use Survey (TUS) conducted during January-December 2024 by the National Statistics Office (NSO) under MoSPI.

- As per TUS 2024, the time spent by women in 'employment-related activities' was 71 minutes per day in 2024, which is 10 minutes more compared to TUS 2019.
- Meanwhile, the time spent by men in 'employment-related activities' increased from 263 minutes (in TUS 2019) to 287 minutes (in TUS 2024).

Key Points:-

- (i) The survey showed that 75% of males and 25% of females in the age group of 15-59 years participated in employment and related activities during a 24-hour day in 2024, compared to 70.9% for males and 21.8% for females in 2019.
- (ii) The time spent by female participants aged 15-59 years in unpaid domestic service declined from





315 minutes (in 2024) to 305 minutes (in 2019), signifying a shift from unpaid to paid activities.

22. CSE and DTE Unveil 12th Edition of State of India's Environment Report 2025.

In February 2025, the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) based in New Delhi, Delhi, and Down To Earth (DTE) Magazine released the 12th edition of the Annual State of India's Environment Report 2025.

- The report was launched at the Anil Agarwal Dialogue 2025, held at the Anil Agarwal Environment Training Institute in Nimli, Rajasthan.
- The State of India's Environment Report 2025 provides a comprehensive analysis of key environmental developments and challenges faced by India.
- The report was officially released by Sunita Narain, Director General (DG) of CSE, alongside notable figures such as India's G20 Sherpa Amitabh Kant, former Planning Commission Deputy Chairperson Montek Singh Ahluwalia, and management expert Raj Liberhan.

Key Points:-

- (i) The report highlights rising temperatures, increasing extreme weather events, air pollution, and biodiversity loss. It also marks the 40th anniversary of the Bhopal Gas Tragedy.
- (ii) 140,000 new chemicals have been introduced into the environment, with 220 billion tonnes released annually, including 65 kg of cancercausing substances per second. India uses 255,000 tonnes of pesticides yearly, raising health

and ecological concerns.

(iii) India faced 255 days of extreme weather in 2024, damaging 3.2 million hectares of farmland. 2024 was the hottest year ever recorded, with global temperatures 1.60°C above pre-industrial levels.

23. Rajasthan Launches SSBY, Offering Rs 1.3 Lakh Accident Insurance Cover to School Students.

In February 2025, Madan Dilawar, the Education and Panchayati Raj Minister of Rajasthan, launched the 'Shiksha Sanjeevani Bima Yojana (SSBY)' during a special event held at Residency Girls Higher Secondary School in Udaipur, Rajasthan.

- This is the first-of-its-kind scheme that aims to provide personal accident insurance coverage ranging from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 1.30 lakh to students in government schools.
- Initially, the scheme will cover schools in the Udaipur Division of Rajasthan.
- The scheme offers insurance coverage in case of accidental death or injury to students. It also provides insurance coverage in case of accidental death of a student's parent.

Key Points:-

- (i) Wonder Cement, Zurich Kotak General Insurance, and State Bank of India (SBI) are partners in the Shiksha Sanjeevani Bima Yojana.
- (ii) The state government plans to eventually expand the scheme, with the goal of benefiting approximately 1 crore school children across the state.





24. PM Narendra Modi Inaugurates Advantage Assam 2.0 Investment & Infrastructure Summit in Guwahati, Assam.

In February 2025, Prime Minister (PM) of India, Narendra Modi inaugurated the two-day Advantage Assam 2.0 Investment & Infrastructure Summit at Khanpara locality, Guwahati, Assam, held from February 25 to 26. Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia announced major initiatives to improve digital connectivity in Northeast India during the Advantage Assam 2.0 Summit.

- Union Minister Scindia announced the launch of a 5G Laboratory (Lab) at Gauhati University in Guwahati, to promote research and skill development in advanced telecom technologies, supporting costeffective testing and future 6G advancements.
- The Ministry of Communications (MoC) is investing Rs 1,800 crore through Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL), based in New Delhi, to expand 4th Generation (4G) and 5th Generation (5G) connectivity across Northeast (NE) India, including remote villages in Assam.
- Under the Samridhi Gram Yojana, each block in Assam will have a 5G Use Application Service to support telemedicine and online education.

Kev Points:-

- (i) Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal, Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and Waterways (MoPSW), announced an investment of over Rs 4,800 crore to boost Assam's inland waterways sector during the Advantage Assam 2.0 Summit.
- (ii) Reliance Industries Limited (RIL) based in Mumbai, Maharashtra, Vedanta Limited also

based in Mumbai, and the Adani Group based in Ahmedabad, Gujarat, have pledged to invest over Rs 1.5 lakh crore in Assam across various sectors, as announced by their respective leaders at the Advantage Assam 2.0 Summit.

25. Gujarat Recently Led India with 19,020 Hectares of Mangrove Plantation in Two Years Under the 'MISHTI' Scheme.

In February 2025, Gujarat recently emerged as the national leader in mangrove afforestation by planting mangroves across approximately 19,020 hectares at a cost of over Rs 76 crore under the Mangrove Initiative for Shoreline Habitats and Tangible Incomes (MISHTI) scheme.

- Gujarat remains determined to environmental conservation, aligning with the vision of 'Viksit Gujarat to Viksit Bharat.' This determination has positioned Gujarat at the leading edge of the Central Government's MISHTI scheme implementation.
- Gujarat's mangrove environment is strategically placed, with Kutch leading the charge at 799 square kilometers (sq km).

Key Points:-

- (i) In 2023, the Government of India (GoI) recently launched the MISHTI scheme on the occasion of World Environment Day (June 5) to increase mangrove forests across coastal states and Union Territories (UTs), ensuring a sustainable future for both communities and ecosystems.
- (ii) The Gol aims to plant 540 sq km of mangroves in five years under the 'MISHTI' scheme.
- (iii) The scheme was recently implemented by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate





Change (MoEFCC).

26. NITI Aayog Report: Women's Credit Monitoring Jumps 42% to Reach 27 Million in 2024.

On March 3, 2025, the Women Entrepreneurship Platform (WEP) of the National Institution for Transforming India (NITI) Aayog, in collaboration with TransUnion CIBIL Limited (formerly Credit Information Bureau (India) Limited) and Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh, UP)-based MicroSave Consulting (MSC), released a new report titled "From Borrowers to Builders: Women's Role in India's Financial Growth Story."

- The report, launched by B.V.R. Subrahmanyam, CEO of NITI Aayog, highlights a notable surge in financial awareness among women, with 27 million actively monitoring their credit as of December 2024, reflecting a 42% increase compared to the previous year.
- In December 2024, women's share in the total self-monitoring base increased to 19.43% from 17.89% in 2023. Non-metro women showed higher engagement, with 48% growth compared to 30% in metro areas. Additionally, Gen Z women led credit monitoring, recording a 56% year-over-year (YoY) increase.
- The number of business accounts opened by women surged 4.6 times, from 8 lakh in 2019 to 37 lakh in 2024. Business loan disbursements rose to ₹1.9 lakh crore in 2024, up from ₹0.7 lakh crore in 2019, though these loans accounted for only 3% of the total loans availed by women.

Key Points:-

(i) Since 2019, women's share in business loan origination has grown by 14%, while their gold

loan share increased by 6%. By December 2024, women made up 35% of business borrowers.

- (ii) Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu (TN), Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh (UP), and Telangana contributed 49% of all self-monitoring women, with the southern region leading at 10.2 million in 2024.
- (iii) Northern and central states like Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh (UP), and Madhya Pradesh (MP) recorded the highest Compounded Annual Growth Rates (CAGR) in active women borrowers over the last five years.

27. PM Modi Releases India's First Riverine Dolphin Estimation Report Showing 6,327 Dolphins Across 28 Rivers in 8 States.

In March 2025, Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi released India's first-ever riverine dolphin estimation report during his visit to Gir National Park (NP) in Gujarat, where he chaired the 7th meeting of the National Board for Wildlife (NBWL). The report was released on the eve of World Wildlife Day (WWD), observed annually on March 3 worldwide.

- According to the report, India has 6,327 riverine dolphins across 28 rivers in 8 states, with 6,324 dolphins found across the Ganga and Brahmaputra river basins, and the remaining 3 Indus river dolphins in the Beas river basin in Punjab.
- Assam, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh (MP), Punjab, and Lakshadweep are identified as the key dolphin hotspot states.

Key Points:-

(i) The survey was conducted between 2021 and 2023 by the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) in





partnership with state forest departments of Punjab, Uttar Pradesh (UP), Bihar, Assam, Jharkhand, Rajasthan, and non-profit organizations including Aaranyak, World Wildlife Fund (WWF), Turtle Survival Alliance, and Wildlife Trust of India.

(ii) UP, with 2,397 dolphins, topped among the 8 states with the highest number of dolphins in the country, followed by Bihar (2,220), West Bengal (WB) (815), and Assam (635).

28. Union Minister Amit Shah Inaugurates 'Workshop on Sustainability & Circularity in Dairy Sector' in New Delhi.

In March 2025, Union Minister Amit Shah of the Ministry of Cooperation (MoC) inaugurated the 'Workshop on Sustainability and Circularity in the Dairy Sector' at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi (Delhi).

- The workshop was organized by the Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying (DAHD) under the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, and Dairying (MoFAH&D) in collaboration with the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB).
- Sustainability, efficiency, and circularity of resources in the dairy sector will play a key role in fulfilling Prime Minister Modi's vision of 'Sahkar se Samriddhi'.

Key Points:-

(i) During the workshop, NDDB signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) to promote sustainable and inclusive growth in the dairy sector by providing technical, financial, and implementation

support.

(ii) NDDB introduced a new financing scheme with an estimated budget of Rs. 1,000 crores aimed at providing financial assistance for small biogas, large-scale biogas plants, and Compressed Biogas (CBG) projects, supporting the scaling up of various manure management models over the next 10 years.

29. India's First World Peace Center Officially Inaugurated in Gurugram, Haryana.

In March 2025, India's first World Peace Center was established under the leadership of Ahimsa Vishwa Bharti founder, Jain Acharya Lokesh Muni, and the efforts of Ahimsa Vishwa Bharti and was inaugurated in Gurugram, Haryana.

• The inauguration ceremony was graced by Ram Nath Kovind, former President of India, along with other dignitaries, including Gulab Chand Kataria, Governor of Punjab, Arif Mohammad Khan, Governor of Bihar, Nayab Singh Saini, Chief Minister (CM) of Haryana, and Rekha Gupta, CM of Delhi.

Key Points:-

- (i) Acharya Lokesh highlighted that the World Peace Center will serve as a beacon of spirituality and social unity, offering a platform for peace education, environmental conservation, equality, and institutional peace-building initiatives.
- (ii) The World Peace Center will play a key role in fostering awareness, promoting social responsibility, supporting sustainable development, and creating institutional networks to enhance peace and harmony.





30. EC President Ursula von der Leyen Leads Historic EU Delegation Visit to India, Strengthening Bilateral Ties.

In February 2025, European Commission (EC) President Ursula von der Leyen, along with the European Union (EU) College of Commissioners, undertook a two-day visit to India from 27th to 28th February 2025. This marked the first-ever visit of the College of Commissioners outside the European continent and also the first visit in the history of India-EU bilateral relations.

- The visit focused on trade and investment, emerging technologies, innovation, talent, digital and green industrial transition, space, defense, and people-to-people exchanges.
- EC President von der Leyen met with Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi, Delhi, to strengthen the EU-India strategic partnership, emphasizing trade, technology, climate change, and security cooperation.
- On 28th February 2025, the 2nd India-EU Trade and Technology Council (TTC) meeting was held in New Delhi, where India and the EU committed to strengthening food security and sustainability. including early warning systems for active pharmaceutical ingredients (APIs) supply, advancing renewable energy cooperation through solar energy, offshore wind, and green hydrogen technologies.

Key Points:-

- (i) India and the EU set a year-end deadline to finalize the long-negotiated bilateral Free Trade Agreement (FTA), which would become the world's largest trade deal of its kind.
- (ii) India and the EU renewed their Science & Technology (S&T) partnership, originally signed in

31. CCI Grants Approval for Key Mergers and Acquisitions on March 4, 2025.

On March 4, 2025, the Competition Commission of India (CCI) approved multiple acquisition proposals across various industries.TPG Scion Singapore Private Limited, based in Singapore, acquired a stake in Schott Poonawalla Private Limited (SPPL), a Pune (Maharashtra)-based company, through a secondary purchase from Serum Institute of India (SII) Private Limited.

- Adani Infra (India) Limited (AIIL), a subsidiary of Adani Enterprises Limited, acquired a 30.07% equity stake in PSP Projects Limited, an Ahmedabad (Gujarat)-based firm, for Rs. 685.36 crore.
- Ambuja Cements Limited (ACL), headquartered in Mumbai (Maharashtra), acquired up to a 72.8% stake in Orient Cement Limited (OCL), a company based in New Delhi (Delhi).
- Shell Deutschland GmbH, a subsidiary of Shell Plc, a global energy company based in the Netherlands, acquired 100% ownership of Raj Petro Specialities Private Limited, located in Mumbai (Maharashtra), through Shell Overseas Investments B.V..

Key Points:-

(i) Roquette Frères S.A, a France-based





company, acquired the Pharma Solutions and specific product lines from the Nourish segment of International Flavors & Fragrances Inc. (IFF), a USA-based company.

- (ii) Alpha Wave Ventures II, LP, based in Florida (USA), acquired a 12.44% stake in Advanta Enterprises Limited, a company headquartered in Mumbai (Maharashtra).
- (iii) JSW Energy Limited (JSWEL), a Mumbai (Maharashtra)-based company, acquired 100% shareholding in KSK Mahanadi Power Company Limited, based in Hyderabad (Telangana), for nearly Rs. 16,000 crore.

33. Gol Launches Pilot Projects for Hydrogen-Fuelled Vehicles Under NHGM.

In March 2025, the Government of India (GoI) launched five pilot projects to deploy hydrogen-fuelled buses and trucks under the National Green Hydrogen Mission (NGHM). This initiative aims to promote clean energy in the transport sector and reduce carbon emissions.

• The Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) had issued guidelines in February 2025 for implementing pilot projects in the transport sector under NGHM. These guidelines outline the framework





for hydrogen-based vehicle trials and refuelling infrastructure development.

- MNRE has approved five pilot projects involving 37 vehicles, including both trucks and buses. These projects will also establish nine hydrogen refuelling stations to support the operation of hydrogen-fuelled vehicles.
- The trial includes 15 hydrogen fuel cell-based vehicles and 22 hydrogen internal combustion engine-based vehicles. These vehicles will be tested on ten different routes across India, including Greater Noida Delhi Agra, Bhubaneswar Konark Puri, Ahmedabad Vadodara Surat, and several others.

Key Points:-

- (i) Several major companies have been awarded these projects, including TATA Motors Limited (TML), Reliance Industries Limited (RIL), National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) Limited, Ashok Leyland, Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL), and Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL).
- (ii) The GoI has allocated financial support of ₹2.08 billion for these projects, which are expected to be completed within 18 to 24 months. The pilot projects will assess the feasibility, safety, and economic viability of hydrogen-powered mobility in India.
- (iii) The National Green Hydrogen Mission (NGHM) was launched in January 2023 by MNRE with an outlay of ₹19,744 crores up to the Financial Year 2029-30. The mission aims to decarbonize the economy, reduce fossil fuel dependency, and position India as a leader in green hydrogen technology and market

development.

34. "MoPR Launches 'Model Women-Friendly Gram Panchayats (MWFGP)' Initiative to Empower Women in Local Governance".

On March 5, 2025, the Ministry of Panchayati Raj (MoPR), Government of India, launched the 'Model Women-Friendly Gram Panchayats (MWFGP)' initiative at the National Convention in Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi, as part of International Women's Day celebrations.

- The initiative aims to enhance women's participation, safety, and leadership in local governance by establishing at least one Model Gram Panchayat in each district of India, reflecting gendersensitive and girl-friendly governance practices.
- The event was attended by Union Minister of State (MoS) Anupriya Patel, Union MoS S.P. Singh Baghel, MoPR officials like Vivek Bharadwaj (Secretary of MoPR), Sushil Kumar Lohani (Additional Secretary of MoPR), and representatives from various ministries and organizations, including UNFPA.
- The model panchayats are designed to align with PM Narendra Modi's vision of creating safer, more inclusive, and socially just Gram Panchayats, contributing to a 'Viksit Bharat' through 'Viksit Panchayats.'

Key Points:-

(i) Two major initiatives were launched: Virtual Training Programs for developing Model Women-Friendly Gram Panchayats and a Real-Time Monitoring Dashboard to track progress and enhance the performance of women-friendly gram





panchayats across India.

- (ii) The digital platform will use technology to track, analyze, and enhance women's participation and welfare at the grassroots level. It will provide real-time insights and data-driven support to empower women leaders nationwide.
- (iii) On March 8, 2025, MoPR will organize a nationwide Mahila Gram Sabha in all Gram Panchayats to promote the goals of the MWFGP initiative and to empower women at the grassroots level.

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the American Spice Trade Association (ASTA) to strengthen international cooperation in the spice trade.

(iii) Paresh Shah, Chairman of the Sub-Committee, Scientific Panel on Pesticide Residues, Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI), announced that a revised Maximum Residue Level (MRL) for spices and culinary herbs is under development, which is expected to enhance global market access for Indian spice exporters.

- Canadian-American actor and film producer Ryan Rodney Reynolds ranked 2nd with an impressive USD 85 million (approximately 70.98 crore), attributed to his roles as lead producer, co-writer, and star of Deadpool & Wolverine.

Key Points:-

(i) American comedian and actor Kevin Darnell Hart secured the 3rd spot, earning USD 81 million (approximately 67.73 crore), driven by his diverse





entertainment ventures, including films, television (TV) series, stand-up comedy, and podcasting.

(ii) American actress Nicole Mary Kidman emerged as the highest-paid actress of 2024, ranking 8th overall with earnings of USD 31 million.

3. Brand Finance 2025: Accenture Tops IT Services Rankings, TCS and Infosys Secure 2nd and 3rd Spots.

In March 2025, Brand Finance released its annual IT Services 25 2025 rankings, highlighting the top Information Technology (IT) services brands worldwide. These rankings are based on their financial performance, market position, and brand perception.

- Accenture PLC, an American multinational company, holds the top spot globally, with a brand value of USD 41.50 billion.
- Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) Limited and Infosys Limited, both Indian IT firms, are ranked 2nd and 3rd, showing India's strong presence in the industry.
- For the first time, Hexaware Technologies Limited from India has entered the rankings at Rank 24, showing its growing market influence.

Key Points:-

- (i) Brand Finance 2025 methodology evaluates IT services brands based on brand value, market strength, financial performance, brand perception, investment, and business performance.
- (ii) The combined brand value of the top 25 IT services brands in 2025 is USD 163 billion.
- (iii) The top five brands alone account for over USD 99.32 billion, highlighting the critical role of IT

services in the global economy.

4. India Ranked 4th Globally with 85,698 HNWIs in The Wealth Report 2025 and Behind US, China, and Japan.

In March 2025, Knight Frank, a global property consultant firm based in London (UK), released the 19th edition of The Wealth Report 2025. According to the report, India ranks 4th globally with an estimated 85,698 High Net-Worth Individuals (HNWIs) in 2024, marking a 6% increase compared to 80,686 HNWIs in 2023. This means India is home to 3.7% of the world's wealthy individuals.

6. Forbes Releases List of Highest-Paid Actors of 2024 Dwayne Johnson Tops with USD 88 Million.

In February 2025, Forbes released its annual list of "The Highest-Paid Actors of 2024," highlighting the massive earnings of Hollywood's top stars across various platforms.

- American actor and professional wrestler Dwayne Douglas Johnson, popularly known as "The Rock," secured the top position globally with earnings of USD 88 million (approximately 73.58 crore), primarily from blockbuster films like Red One and voicing Maui in Moana 2.
- Canadian-American actor and film producer Ryan Rodney Reynolds ranked 2nd with an impressive USD 85 million (approximately 70.98 crore), attributed to his roles as lead producer, co-writer, and star of Deadpool & Wolverine.

1. RBI Levies Monetary Penalty on Bombay Mercantile Co-operative Bank Limited and Two Other Banks.

In February 2025, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) imposed a monetary penalty of Rs 33.30 lakh on Bombay Mercantile Co-operative Bank Limited, based in Mumbai (Maharashtra), for violating certain provisions and earning income from business activities not permitted under the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.





- As of March 31, 2023, the RBI conducted a statutory inspection of the bank with reference to its financial position.
- The penalty was imposed under the powers conferred on the RBI by Section 47A(1)(c) read with Sections 46(4)(i) and 56 of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

Key Points:-

- (i) The RBI also imposed a monetary penalty of Rs 1 lakh each on two other co-operative banks: Business Co-operative Bank Limited (Nashik, Maharashtra) and Lasalgaon Merchant Co-operative Bank Limited (Nashik).
- (ii) These two banks were found violating certain provisions and failing to adhere to directions issued by the RBI regarding "Income Recognition, Asset Classification, Provisioning, and Other Related Matters for Urban Co-operative Banks (UCBs)."
- 2. BoB Introduces Merchant Loyalty and Cashback Program to Promote CBDC.

On 27 February 2025, Bank of Baroda (BoB), based in Vadodara (Gujarat), launched a pilot for a "Merchant Loyalty/Cashback Programme" using programmable Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) for its customers through the "bob Merchant App."

• The project, developed under the guidance of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), allows small and mediumsized merchants to create and manage their own loyalty programs.

- Merchants banking with BoB and registered on the app can set up cashback offers without incurring additional infrastructure costs.
- Pharmacies, grocery stores, and local retailers can customize their loyalty campaigns by adjusting the duration, cashback percentage, and expiry date.

Key Points:-

- (i) Customers using the digital rupee app for purchases will receive cashback in the form of programmable CBDC. This offer is currently available only to BoB account holders. The cashback can be redeemed at the same merchant outlet before its expiry.

- The arrangement aims to enhance financial cooperation between Japan and India, complementing other global and regional financial safety nets.

- This framework was introduced by SEBI through a circular issued in exercise of powers under Section 11(1) of the SEBI Act, 1992, read with Chapter VI-C of the SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations 1996, to protect investors' interests in securities and to promote the development and regulation of the securities market.
- The new framework will come into force on April 1, 2025.

6. SEBI allows NBFCs and HFCs to invest in Security Receipts (SRs) issued by Asset Reconstruction Companies (ARCs).

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has allowed all Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs), including Housing Finance Companies (HFCs), to invest in Security Receipts (SRs) issued by Asset Reconstruction Companies (ARCs).

- All NBFCs, including HFCs, regulated by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), are now considered qualified buyers. This means they can invest in SRs under the Securitisation and Reconstruction of Financial Assets and Enforcement of Security Interest Act, 2002 (SARFAESI Act), subject to certain conditions.
- This important change by SEBI aims to encourage investment in the bad loans sector and expand the pool of investors who can buy SRs from ARCs, which will improve liquidity in the distressed asset market.

Key Points:-

- (i) SEBI has extended the deadline for reporting differential rights issued by Alternative Investment Funds (AIFs) to March 31, 2025 (previously it was February 28, 2025). This extension followed requests from the industry for more time to comply.
- (ii) This change comes from amendments to the SEBI (Alternative Investment Funds) Regulations, 2012, which were notified on November 18, 2024. The goal is to ensure that investors receive their rights and share of proceeds in proportion to their investments within a scheme, while maintaining equal treatment (pari-passu).

7. Mintoak has acquired Digiledge in India's first E-Rupee deal, valued at USD 3.5 million.

On March 3, 2025, Mintoak Innovations Private Limited, an Indian startup based in Mumbai (Maharashtra), and supported by PayPal and HDFC Bank (formerly Housing Development Finance Corporation Bank), acquired Digiledge, a company based in Bengaluru (Karnataka). This marks the first acquisition in the emerging Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) sector, valued at USD 3.5 million.

• The integration of Digiledge's services will enable Mintoak's partner banks, including HDFC Bank, Axis Bank (based in Mumbai, Maharashtra), and State Bank of India (SBI, also based in Mumbai), to offer better CBDC-related payment solutions to their customers.

Key Points:-

- (i) In December 2022, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), based in Mumbai (Maharashtra), started a pilot program for the e-rupee, which is a digital alternative to physical currency. The program expanded in April 2024 to include payment firms, allowing companies like Mintoak to actively participate.

15. ARCIL has acquired the stressed loan portfolio of Ujjivan SFB for Rs. 34 crore.

On March 3, 2025, Asset Reconstruction Company (India) Limited (ARCIL), based in Mumbai (Maharashtra) and supported by the Avenue Capital Group (USA) and the State Bank of India (SBI), acquired the non-performing microfinance loan portfolio of Ujjivan Small Finance Bank (SFB) from Bengaluru (Karnataka) for Rs. 34.26 crore. The total value of the loan portfolio was Rs. 365.5 crore.

• This transaction resulted in a recovery rate of about 9.39%, meaning the lender faced a loss of approximately 90%.

Key Points:-

(i) ARCIL started the deal with its anchor bid, which led to a 'Swiss Challenge' auction for the

loan portfolio.

- (ii) Ujjivan SFB invited counterbids, offering a 5% higher bid than the anchor bid. However, no higher bids came in, and ARCIL's offer was accepted.
- (iii) This sale is part of Ujjivan SFB's ongoing efforts to clean up its balance sheet and improve asset quality by reducing Non-Performing Assets (NPAs).

MOUs and Agreement

1. TRIFED Recently Signed MoUs with NIFT & HPMC to Boost Tribal Entrepreneurship.

In February 2025, New Delhi (Delhi)-based Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India Limited (TRIFED), under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs (MOTA), recently signed Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with New Delhi-based National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT) and Shimla (Himachal Pradesh, HP)-based Himachal Pradesh Horticultural Produce Marketing and Processing Corporation (HPMC) to promote tribal businesses.

- The MoUs were recently signed during the flagship event 'Aadi Mahotsav,' held in New Delhi, Delhi, from 16 to 24 February 2025.
- The MoU between TRIFED and NIFT was recently signed and exchanged between TRIFED General Manager (GM) Sandeep Pahalwan and NIFT Director Head Office Gauray Mishra.
- The MoU between TRIFED and HPMC was recently signed and exchanged between TRIFED GM Mamta Sharma and HPMC GM Sunny Sharma.

Key Points:-





- (i) The collaboration aims to strengthen tribal marketing strategies by shifting from a business-to-consumer (B2C) model to a business-to-business (B2B) approach.
- (ii) These strategic partnerships focus on empowering tribal artisans and entrepreneurs by promoting handloom, handicrafts, and forest products, while also enhancing horticultural and forest product processing.

2. India and Nepal Ink MoU to Enhance Collaboration in WASH Sector.

On 3 March 2025, the Government of India (GoI) and the Government of Nepal signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to enhance cooperation in the Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) sector, including waste management.

- The agreement aims to improve access to clean drinking water and sanitation by fostering collaboration between both nations and strengthening intergovernmental cooperation in the WASH sector.
- The MoU was signed in New Delhi, Delhi, in the presence of Union Minister Chandrakant Raghunath Patil, Ministry of Jal Shakti (MoJS), India, and Pradeep Yadav, Minister of Water Supply, Nepal, along with senior officials from both countries.

Key Points:-

- (i) Both countries will engage in capacity-building initiatives, including training programs for Nepali personnel in water resource management and related fields.
- (ii) India and Nepal will exchange technological expertise and best practices in the WASH sector, while also collaborating on groundwater projects,

including rainwater harvesting, artificial recharge, and quality enhancement.

(iii) The MoU reflects a shared commitment to public health, sustainability, and regional cooperation, strengthening ties between the two nations in the WASH sector.

3. ISM, TEPL & TSMPL Ink Fiscal Support Agreement for Semiconductor Fabrication.

On March 5, 2025, India Semiconductor Mission (ISM), Tata Electronics Private Limited (TEPL), and Tata Semiconductor Manufacturing Private Limited (TSMPL) signed a Fiscal Support Agreement (FSA) to establish India's first commercial semiconductor fabrication unit in Dholera, Gujarat.

- TEPL's semiconductor fab in Dholera Special Investment Region (SIR) involves an investment of over ₹91,000 crore and has a capacity of 50,000 wafer starts per month (WSPM).
- The Government of India (GoI), through ISM, has committed to providing 50% fiscal support on a paripassu basis for qualified project expenses, showcasing its dedication to building a world-class semiconductor ecosystem.
- The project is expected to create over 20,000 direct and indirect skilled jobs. TEPL will collaborate with Taiwan-based Powerchip Semiconductor Manufacturing Corporation (PSMC) to bring global expertise to India's semiconductor industry.

Key Points:-

(i) The semiconductor fab will cater to global markets in sectors such as Artificial Intelligence (AI), communications, computing, and automobiles, strengthening India's role in the





global semiconductor supply chain.

- (ii) ISM was launched in 2021 under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) with a financial outlay of ₹76,000 crore to promote semiconductor, display manufacturing, and design ecosystems in India.
- (iii) ISM oversees four key schemes under the Semicon India Programme, including the Scheme for setting up Semiconductor Fabs, the Scheme for setting up Display Fabs, the Scheme for Compound Semiconductors, Silicon Photonics, Sensors, ATMP/OSAT facilities, and the Design Linked Incentive (DLI) Scheme.

4. Solar Defence and Aerospace Secures Rs 239 Crore Contract with Ministry of Defence.

In March 2025, Nagpur (Maharashtra)-based Solar Industries India Limited (SIIL) announced that its wholly owned subsidiary, Solar Defence and Aerospace Limited, has signed a contract worth Rs 239 crore with the Ministry of Defence (MoD), Government of India (GoI), for the supply of multimode hand grenades.

• The project involves the supply of multi-mode hand grenades for the MoD, to be completed within 1 year.

Key Points:-

- (i) The agreement will boost India's defence manufacturing capabilities and aligns with the government's vision of self-reliance in defence.
- (ii) SIIL is the flagship company of the Solar Group, which produces bulk explosives, packaged explosives, and initiating systems for use in the mining, infrastructure, and building sectors.

5. TRIFED Recently Signed MoUs with NIFT & HPMC to Boost Tribal Entrepreneurship.

2. Chinese architect Liu Jiakun has been awarded the 2025 Pritzker Architecture Prize.

On March 4, 2025, Chinese architect Liu Jiakun was named the '2025 Pritzker Architecture Prize Laureate,' the highest honor in the field of architecture. He will be celebrated in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates (UAE) in May 2025.

- Liu Jiakun became the 54th winner of the Pritzker Prize and the second Chinese architect to receive this honor, following Wang Shu in 2012. He was awarded for his respect for culture, history, and nature, as well as his ability to imagine and build new worlds without being restricted by any specific style or aesthetic.
- The Pritzker Architecture Prize, created in 1979 by businessman Jay A. Pritzker and his wife Cindy through their Hyatt Foundation in Chicago, USA, is an international prize awarded annually to a living architect whose work demonstrates continuous excellence in architecture.
- The Pritzker Prize, often referred to as "architecture's Nobel" and "the profession's highest honor," includes a USD 100,000 grant and a bronze medallion. In 2024, the prize was awarded to Japanese architect Riken Yamamoto. Notably, Indian architect Balkrishna Vithaldas (BV) Doshi became the first Indian to win the Pritzker Prize in 2018 for his outstanding lifelong contribution to architecture.

Key Points:-

- (i) In 1999, Liu Jiakun founded 'Jiakun Architects' in Chengdu, China. Over the past four decades, he has completed over 30 projects across China, including work in education, culture, public spaces, commerce, and urban planning.
- (ii) His designs focus on a human-centered





approach, sensitivity to context, and innovation in materials. His work often blends traditional Chinese elements with local materials, and his Rebirth Brick Project (inspired by the 2008 Wenchuan earthquake) emphasizes sustainability.

(iii) Some notable projects by Liu Jiakun include the Luyeyuan Stone Sculpture Art Museum (2002), Sichuan Fine Arts Institute Sculpture Department (2002), West Village (2015), Suzhou Museum of Imperial Kiln Brick (2016), and the Tianbao Cave District Renovation (2020).

- Tushar Mehta is a partner and co-head of research at a quantitative hedge fund in New York, United States of America (USA). He became the second Indian-origin person, after Gopi Thotakura, to take a Blue Origin flight as part of the NS-25 Mission.
- The suborbital New Shepard (NS) vehicle of Blue Origin was launched from the West Texas facility on February 25, 2025.
- The flight was designated as NS-30 by Blue Origin, marking the New Shepard's 30th overall flight.

Key Points:-

- (i) The six-member crew included Lane Bess, Jesús Calleja, Elaine Chia Hyde, Dr. Richard Scott, Tushar Mehta, and an undisclosed sixth crew member.
- (ii) The NS-30 mission was Lane Bess' second flight with Blue Origin.

In February 2025, China successfully launched two new satellites, 'Siwei Gaojing-1 03' and 'Siwei Gaojing-1 04,' into sun-synchronous orbit approximately 500 kilometers (km) above Earth using the Long March-2C carrier rocket. The rocket was launched from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center in Northwest China.

 These satellites are equipped with high-resolution optical imagers and will be used for data collection to





support natural resource management, urban planning, and other commercial applications.

- This launch marks the 561st flight mission of the Long March carrier rocket series.
- In February 2025, China successfully launched two high-resolution satellites, 'Siwei Gaojing-1 03' and 'Siwei Gaojing-1 04', into a 500 km sun-synchronous orbit using the Long March-2C rocket from Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center. These satellites will support natural resource management, urban planning, and commercial operations.

- (ii) Developed by CALT (China Academy of Launch Vehicle Technology), the Long March-2C is a two-stage launch vehicle with storable propellants.
- (iii) It measures 43 meters in length, 3.35 meters in width, and has a lift-off mass of 242.5 metric tons (MT). This mission marks the 561st flight of the Long March series.
- 3. DRDO Successfully Tests Indigenous Life Support System for Tejas Fighter Jet.

On March 4, 2025, the Defence Bio-Engineering & ElectroMedical Laboratory (DEBEL), a Bengalurubased DRDO lab under the Ministry of Defence (MoD), successfully conducted high-altitude trials

- of the On-Board Oxygen Generating System (OBOGS)-based Integrated Life Support System (ILSS) for the Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas.
- DEBEL, specialized in aerospace life-support systems, designed and developed the OBOGS-ILSS and tested it on the Tejas Prototype Vehicle-3 under extreme conditions, including altitudes up to 50,000 feet and high-G maneuvers, with validation from the Centre for Military Airworthiness & Certification (CEMILAC).
- Larsen & Toubro (L&T) manufactured the system under DRDO's guidance, ensuring technical precision.
 The ILSS features 90% indigenous components, showcasing L&T's capabilities and supporting India's self-reliance goals.
- The OBOGS-ILSS replaces traditional liquid oxygen systems by generating oxygen in real time using molecular sieve technology. It integrates critical components like the Anti-Gravity Valve (Anti-G Valve) and Emergency Oxygen System (EOS) to enhance pilot safety during combat.

Key Points:-

- (i) The system's development involved multiple R&D partners, including DEBEL, Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA), Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL), and the Indian Air Force (IAF), with certification and quality assurance from CEMILAC, Directorate General of Aeronautical Quality Assurance (DGAQA), and the National Flight Test Center (NFTC).
- (ii) The OBOGS-ILSS eliminates reliance on imported liquid oxygen, enhances Tejas' combat readiness by providing a lighter and safer life-support system, and increases operational flexibility for the Indian Air Force.
- (iii) The technology can be adapted for other





fighter aircraft, including the MiG-29K, expanding its strategic impact beyond Tejas and strengthening India's defense capabilities.

4. NASA and Nokia Unveil the First Mobile Network on the Moon.

In February 2025, NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) from Washington, D.C. (USA) and Nokia from Espoo (Finland) are set to launch the first mobile network on the Moon. This will be part of the IM-2 mission by Intuitive Machines.

 This project is a key part of NASA's Artemis program, which aims to bring humans back to the Moon by 2027.

Key Points:-

- (i) As part of the IM-2 mission, the Athena lander will be sent to the Moon to deploy Nokia's Lunar Surface Communication System (LSCS), which will use Earth-based cellular technology to establish connectivity on the Moon.
- (ii) The network will operate on 4G Long-Term Evolution (LTE) technology, ensuring fast and reliable connectivity for future lunar missions.
- (iii) This mobile network will allow astronauts, lunar vehicles, and mission control to communicate with each other. It will help with real-time data transmission, video calls, and remote operations on the Moon.
